Preparation for the Transition Planning and Implementation Sessions

- consideration of a ministry definition of ‘at risk’

- professional learning opportunities within schools that have led to increased shared responsibility among teachers for students at risk
- proposed e-Learning opportunities between the ministry and school boards (i.e., the use of Adobe Connect for professional learning)

Any input gathered can be shared at Part One of the 2007-08 Transition Planning and Implementation sessions. Student Success Leaders can share the input in any format they deem appropriate (for example, orally - at the time of the teleconference, or by e-mail).
